## Recycling Today to Save Tomorrow

To receive an award, they must demonstrate that they made an impact on their community. Part of their community is St. Paul Lutheran School. After touring the St Francois County Environmental Corporation transfer station (SFCEC), they requested a recycling container for our school. This is a trial through June to see how much we actually can recycle. If it is a large amount, we may negotiate a new contract with CWI to reduce our solid waste pickup.

Behind our school is a large recycling container. St. Paul School families and Church are allowed to use this container for recyclables. Please read carefully the back of this flyer to see what items are acceptable.

### **DO NOT PUT PLASTIC TRASH BAGS IN THE CONTAINER.**

They are not recyclable. In fact, any thin plastic, such as cellophane, twist ties or wrappers are not acceptable. However, all heavier plastic containers generally are. Please check the back if you are in doubt or you may ask in the office or Mrs. Johnson.

Some families are recycling aluminum cans for Craig Thomas. Those bags are stored at the church office. We encourage everyone to continue to do this great service for Craig!

The 8<sup>th</sup> grade is also visiting Farmington City Council on March 13 at 6:30 p.m. to make a presentation. They are asking the city to provide a drop-off facility for the community. You are welcome to attend and be a presence at the meeting.
